CITY OF VACAVILLE ADA ACCESSIBILITY GUIDELINES REQUIRED FOR STANDS ON CITY/PUBLIC PROPERTY

The federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, requires that all events and activities held on City property (including buildings, parks, sidewalks, and public rights-of-way) must be accessible to people with disabilities. The following is to assist you in ensuring that your stand is ADA accessible.

GENERAL

- Your stand site should have accessible parking and accessible paths of travel. These should already be incorporated into city sites, but make sure your stand doesn't block any access points.
- Service animals must be allowed to accompany their owners at all times. Other animals visiting your stand must follow all public health and safety guidelines.
- Your stand counter height must be no more than 36 inches from the ground, and the width must be at least 36 inches wide.

PATHS OF TRAVEL

- An ADA accessible route must be provided at a minimum of 36 inches in width.
- All cords, wires, hoses, etc., that are located within a path of travel must be ramped or placed within a cord cover.
- An alternative path of travel is required when the existing pedestrian access route (like a sidewalk) in a public right-of-way is obstructed by temporary conditions (like your stand).
 - If an alternative path of travel is needed, signage designating the alternative path is required.
 - Where possible, the alternative path of travel shall be parallel to the disrupted pedestrian access route, and on the same side of the street.
 - Where the alternative path of travel is adjacent to potentially hazardous conditions (like construction areas), the path must be protected with a barricade.
